WHAT ARE WE DOING?

In partnership, ARCH Disability Law Centre, Canadian Research Centre on Inclusive Education, Community Living Ontario, University of Western Ontario, Brock University and Inclusive Education Canada are conducting a survey on the experiences of students who have an intellectual disability in our Kindergarten to grade 12 school system.

WHY ARE WE DOING THIS?

In Ontario, there are 72 Boards of Education. Seven of those boards operate fully segregated schools for children who have a disability. In the remaining school boards, a significant number (approximately 80 - 85%) continue to segregate students through self-contained classes where they spend the majority of the day.

HOW CAN YOU PARTICIPATE?

We are interested in hearing the voices of parents of children who have an intellectual disability about their experiences in the school system. If you wish to participate, please complete a short survey that asks questions about your child's experiences in school.

The survey will take 20-30 minutes to complete. You will have a month to complete the survey on the same computer. Once it has been submitted, you cannot redo the survey.
