IT'S OUR HOME TOO, SAY LOCAL ADVOCATES

That's the main message being promoted among candidates seeking a seat on Belleville's City Council by local community advocates for the Affordable Housing Action Network. AHAN's Advocacy Committee has recently extended an invitation to all candidates in the upcoming Municipal Elections for Belleville/Thurlow to attend information sessions on NOVEMBER 7 starting at NOON and running to TWO in Gallery #2 of the Belleville Public Library.

The information sessions are designed to assist new candidates for municipal council better understand the role they can play in addressing the problem of providing support for adequate housing and shelter, an issue critical to some of our community's most vulnerable citizens, says local spokesperson for AHAN, Michele Leering.

There are, in fact, two sessions currently planned for November 7. The first will be for all new candidates running for City Council. The second session, starting at approximately 1:15PM, is for candidates seeking re-election to Council.

The sessions are open to the public, subject to available seating capacity of the room.

The Affordable Housing Action Network (AHAN) is a group of more than 30 local agencies, organizations and individuals who have a common interest in creating more affordable housing for the citizens of Hastings County and its communities.
